

## NAJYRC ENDURANCE CHAMPIONSHIPS 2\* and 4\*

**Payment of Entry Fees-** Entry fees for the 2\* paid by check should be made to NAJYRC and brought to the event ( since time is short) and given to Jan Stevens. Foreign entries may pay along with the 4\* if that is more convenient.

4\* please pay by July 22 directly to USEF. You can send a check either through your Zone Rep or directly to USEF or you can call or fax credit card information to: FAX (859) 231-6662 or secure CC phone (859) 225 6950. Total fee is \$558.00 **Be sure to include your name and NAJYRC Endurance with the check.**

**Arrival** – Earliest arrival without additional cost is 8:00am on Monday, July 25. Plan to arrive between 8:00am and 8:00pm. All horses must be in the venue Tuesday, July 26<sup>th</sup> by noon. ### Requirements to enter the Park-

#### 1. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Details on compulsory health tests and, where applicable, quarantine period and protocol, etc. **PLEASE APPEND SPECIMEN IMPORT LICENCES WHICH WILL BE APPLIED TO HORSES ATTENDING THIS EVENT.** In case of doubt or problems, please contact the FEI Veterinary Department as soon as possible.

All horses must have an FEI passport.

#### Entry into Kentucky:

##### General Requirements:

(a) All horses and other equidae entering Kentucky shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection except horses and other equidae purchased at an approved out-of-state horse sale. Certificate shall include all tests that have been conducted as well as all vaccinations including vaccination date and type of vaccine used.

(b) Attached to the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall be a copy of a certificate of report from a laboratory approved by the USDA showing the animal(s) to be negative to an AGID test or other USDA approved test for equine infectious anemia.

(c) Horses with evidence of a contagious, infectious or communicable disease or exposure thereto shall not be eligible for entry.

**Non entered Horses-** Horses which are not entered in the competition will not be allowed on the grounds. The following is a contact for Boarding – both paddock and stall boarding with a 1 mile exercise track and room to school/ride. It is located about 15 minutes from the park:

### **Substitution of Horses-**

Substitutions will be allowed up until 2 hours before the First Inspection.

4\*- Definite entries must reach the OC at the latest four (4) days preceding the beginning of the Event. These represent the final selection of Athletes and Horses that will travel to the Event. The definite entries may not exceed the number listed and must be chosen from the list of names on the nominated entries. After the definite entries have been sent in, substitutions of Athletes and/or Horses may only be made with the express permission of the OC.

Horses and riders must have been listed on the Definite Entry. Should a 4\* rider's horse not be able to compete, the rider may compete in the 2\* with any qualified horse, with the permission of the OC.

2\*- Substitutions will be allowed up until 2 hours before the first Horse inspection. For the 2\* only, substitute horses not listed on the definite entry may be entered only with the permission of the OC.

No substitution of horses not entered in the event and on the grounds will be allowed after the First Inspection for either the 2\* or 4\* competitions.

**Naming of teams and individuals-** Teams and individuals for both the 2\* and 4\* will be named according to the procedures. Individuals from a zone who are not placed on their zone team may ride as individuals or may join a combined team. Changes in the team/ individuals can only be made in case of injury or illness, and must be made by the Chef d' equipe and must follow the procedures. 2\* teams will be finalized as soon as possible after the entry deadline.

**Allocation of space at the venue-** Horses will be stabled with the trailers at the endurance venue. Zones/ Countries will be given space together according to their number of entries. Parking will be organized upon your arrival. I would advise you to call Jan Stevens at this number when you are getting near the park, to be sure someone is there to assist you. Jan's cell # is (307) 752-7952 Crewing and Vet Check will all be within an area that is perimeter fenced.

**Entry into the park-** All vehicles will need a parking pass. Those are \$5.00 per vehicle for the entire event, and can be purchased at the entrance to the park.

**Transportation within the Park-** You will be able to travel from the main entrance to our venue, near the Indoor Arena. The short route from our venue to the opening and closing and parties, however will be closed to traffic, so you will want to consider renting a golf cart. You can drive and park near the stadium (ceremonies, parties, hospitality location) but it is a roundabout drive. To rent golf carts, call Devers (859) 455-9586. Or at this site: <http://www.deverinc.com/> You may want to join the Cart Parade and decorate your golf cart (see schedule). Just remember that you may not damage the cart in the process. I have included a map and route information this in this packet.

**Dress-** Opening ceremonies- zone uniforms are recommended. Even if you are placed on a mixed team, I recommend that you wear your Zone's uniform and march with your home zone. You will be marching in for opening on foot. We have a banner that says "USA Endurance". However each zone or region for the other disciplines often has a banner, so you may want to consider having one made. Teams can have sponsors and the sponsors can be named on the banners. Shirts should have collars and sleeves. Either slacks or riding pants may be worn.

During the event- dress should consistent with FEI rules. Riders will wear pinnies. EXPECT WARM WEATHER! It has been around 90 most of the month.

Welcome party- casual or team uniform is fine.

Dance- (Saturday) This is a competitors party ( juniors/Young riders), so we may organize something different for the adults. Stay tuned. Not a "dressy" affair, so just what you might wear to a casual dance.

**Meals-** meals will be provided for the rider, two grooms per rider, and the chef d'equipe for each zone in the Hospitality Tent. The hospitality schedule is included in this packet.

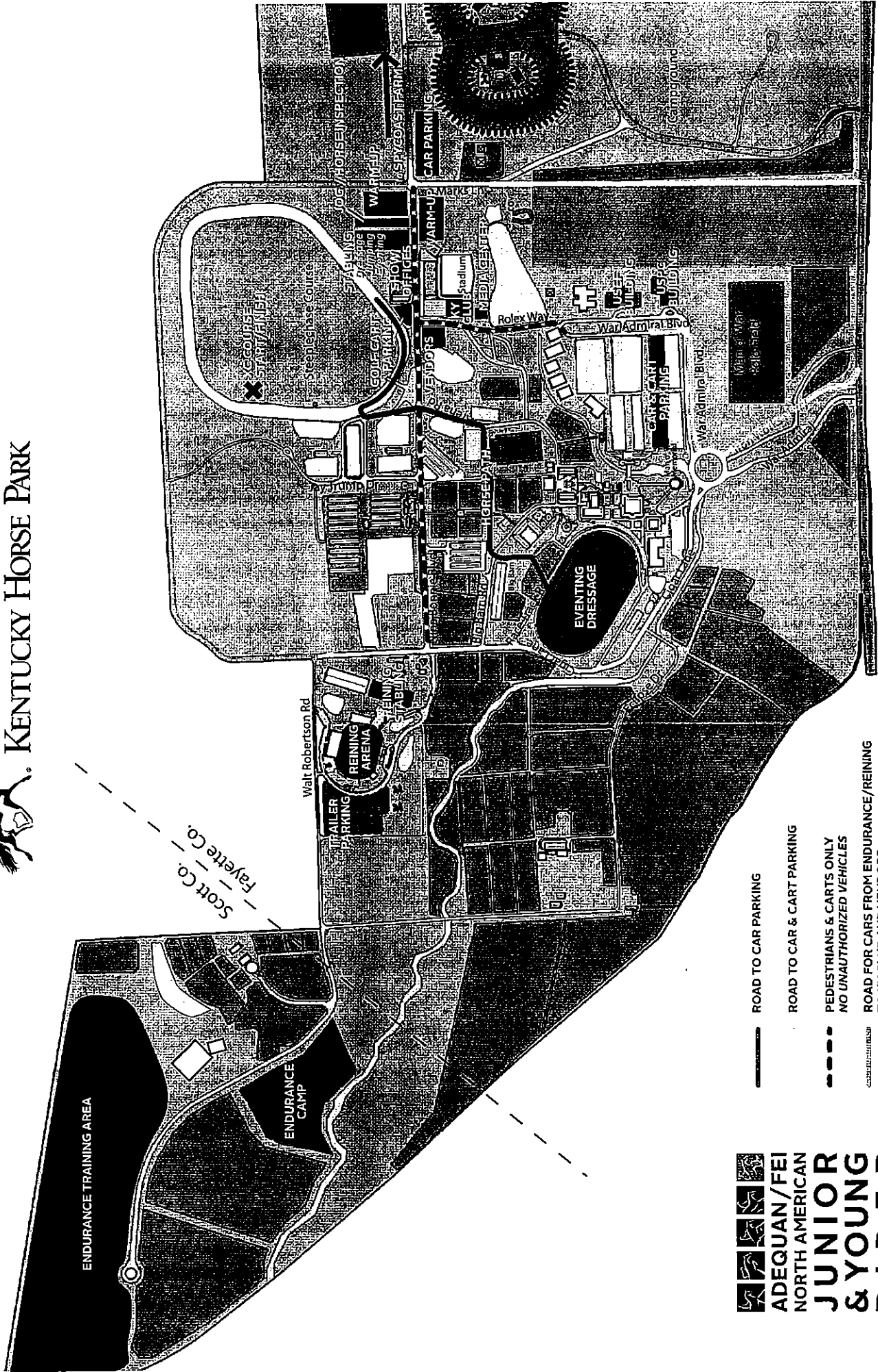

## Parking and Golf Carts at the 2011 North American Junior & Young Rider Championships

Please read the following information carefully as failing to do so can result in ticketing and substantial delays. Also, please review the map carefully as the stabling area has moved for 2011.

### General Notes:

- All parking areas will be clearly marked and parking in areas designated as 'Reserved' or areas where parking is prohibited may result in ticketing by Kentucky Horse Park Police.
- During the competition in order to maintain a safe environment, all of Rolex Way (the dam road) will be closed and Nina Bonnie will be closed from Cigar Lane to Marks Lane. Only official vehicles and golf carts will be permitted to drive along these routes.
- Reining and Endurance competitors will be able to park at their respective venues by entering through the main Kentucky Horse Park entrance. To access the KY Club and Vendor areas by car, please follow the orange highlighted road on the venue map. Golf carts can proceed directly down Nina Bonnie.

There are **TWO** choices for parking during NAJYRC by the Rolex Stadium, Hospitality Area, Medical Center, FEI Stabling (Dressage, Jumping, Eventing), and Vendors:

1. Car Parking (grass):
  - If you are driving to the competition venue each day and plan to walk to the stabling and competition areas, parking will be just east of the main stadium along Nina Bonnie.
  - Enter the Horse Park using the CAMPGROUND entrance via Campground Rd. This is the only way to access the parking lot adjacent to the stabling area and main stadium.
2. Car & Golf Cart Parking (asphalt):
  - If you want to drive your golf cart from the parking lot to the stabling and competition areas, parking will be in the main Kentucky Horse Park lots between the US Equestrian Federation and US Pony Club offices. Golf carts will be able to drive across Forego Lane (the dam road) and can be parked overnight in the main Kentucky Horse Park lots.

### Trailers:

- All trailer parking will be at the Alltech Arena. Trailers will be allowed to unload at the stabling area and then must proceed to the Alltech Arena. Please lock your trailers.

### Golf Carts:

- You must be a licensed driver in order to operate a golf cart. This is a USEF and KY Horse Park rule.
- Only **ONE** NAJYRC Official Golf Cart Pass will be issued to **EACH** team. Only golf carts with this pass will be allowed in to the stabling area and must park in the designated area within stabling.
- Park only in designated areas – either by the Steeplechase Barn adjacent to the stabling area or in the asphalt lot. If you park your cart in any other location, as a courtesy, we will move it for you. Our courteousness may not extend to telling you where it was moved to.
- Always lock up your golf carts if leaving them unattended.

As a United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF) competitor and/or horse owner, I acknowledge my obligation to uphold and adhere to the highest standards of horsemanship, sportsmanship, and citizenship whenever I am representing my country whether as a team member, individual competitor, or horse owner, and whether during actual competition or not.

As a horseman, I will place my horse's welfare above all other considerations and faithfully observe both the USEF and the FEI Codes of Conduct.

As a sportsman, I will know and comply with all pertinent rules of USEF as my National Governing Body (NGB), the FEI as the International Governing Body, and, when applicable, the U.S. and International Olympic Committees, and honor the principles of fair play inherent in them. I will place the interests of the team above my own, and respect the decisions of its duly appointed/elected officials, made in the team's best interest.

As a citizen, I will respect the laws of my own country as well as those of foreign countries in which I or my horse(s) may compete. Knowing that as a USEF competitor and/or horse owner I also serve as an Ambassador for my sport, USEF, and my country. I will endeavor at all times to reflect credit on them through my conduct, dress, and behavior.

I clearly acknowledge my responsibility to ensure that my employees who accompany me whenever I am competing and/or representing my country also abide by this Code of Conduct.

I understand and accept that serious or repeated transgressions of these Codes may be grounds for suspension from a squad or team, or other appropriate disciplinary action. In addition, I agree to abide by selection procedures established by USEF wherever applicable.

Finally, I fully understand that entries will not be made until this application form is signed and completed in full and that this application indicates my intent to compete. Failure to participate may result in disciplinary action on USEF by the FEI (FEI Statutes 002.1, GR121.12, 165). I agree to reimburse all fines imposed by the FEI on USEF for failure to participate in the competitions entered and agree to honor all other penalties including possible and further disciplinary action.

## 2011 RELEASE, ASSUMPTION OF RISK, WAIVER AND INDEMNIFICATION

**This document waives important legal rights. Read it carefully before signing. All Endurance Riders must sign.**

I AGREE that in consideration for my participation to compete in the North American Junior and Young Rider Championships ("NAJYRC") to the following:

I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in NAJYRC with my horse, as a rider, lessee, owner, agent, coach, trainer, chef d'equipe or as parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor. I am fully aware and acknowledge that horse sports and NAJYRC involve inherent dangerous risks of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering, or death ("Harm").

I AGREE to release the Fédération Equestre Internationale ("FEI"), United States Equestrian Federation ("USEF"), Kentucky Horse Park, Gaylord Highlander, Kentuckiana Farms, Spy Coast Farm, Black Fences/After Hours Farm, UK-AG Department, Dunroven Stud, Steve and Martha Brown, Secretarial Center, Barton Brothers Farm, Kentucky Horse Shows LLC, American Vaulting Association, Andrew Ellis, Jumps by Fuzzy, Inc., and the Organizing Committee ("Released Parties") from all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of the Released Parties.

I AGREE to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, including Harm resulting from the negligence of the Released Parties.

I AGREE to indemnify (that is, to pay any losses, damages, or costs incurred by) the Released Parties and to hold them harmless with respect to claims for Harm to me or my horse, and for claims made by others for any Harm caused by me or my horse at NAJYRC.

I have read the FEI Rules about protective equipment and I understand that I am entitled to wear protective equipment without penalty, and I acknowledge that the Released Parties strongly encourage me to do so while WARNING that no protective equipment can guard against all injuries.

If I am a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor, I consent to my child's participation and AGREE to all of the above provisions and AGREE to assume all of the obligations of this Release on the child's behalf.

I AGREE that the "FEI" and "USEF" as used above includes all of their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers and affiliated organizations.

I represent that I have the requisite training, coaching and abilities to safely compete in NAJYRC.

I AGREE that if I am injured at NAJYRC, the medical personnel treating my injuries may provide information on my injury and treatment to the USEF on the official USEF accident/injury report form.
